

Record Books Due June 19

Member record books are due by noon, Sunday, June 19. Members who wish to exhibit in any category in the San Mateo County Fair in August must submit a record book. Please deliver completed record books to Janae Novotny or Sandra Bernhard. Members who enter their record books at the county level should deliver them to Sandra Bernhard as soon as the books are returned by the county. All record books will be returned to members at the September general meeting.

The club web site (eatonhills4h.home.comcast.net) contains links to the state 4-H web site, where you will find Word and PDF versions of the Personal Development Form and Project Report Form. If you missed our informative Record Book Workshop, helpful materials will be available at the May 17 general meeting.

If you are claiming credit for demonstrations, you must complete a Demonstrative Verification Form and submit it with your record book. Forms are available on the club web site

Check Your Attendance Record Now

Members must attend 80% of the monthly general membership meetings, attend 80% of the member's project meetings and submit a record book to be a member in good standing and eligible to exhibit at the San Mateo County Fair. Achieving a star rank also requires 80% attendance at monthly meetings.

Excused absences count toward the 80% calculation. You must bring a note to the Secretary the month before or after your absence for your excused absence to be registered. (Check the club web site for the full attendance policy.)

Check your monthly meeting attendance status with Club Secretary Samantha Cotter at the May 17 general meeting or the June 5 meeting and BBQ. If you believe the Club's attendance records are inaccurate, please submit to the Secretary in writing your reasons for believing that the records are incorrect.
