Lucas, Caitlyn, Cutler, and Gabriella Pons, and Peri and Russell Wong as they give their demonstrations at County Presentation Day on **February 4, 2006**. Attending Presentation Day, whether you're planning to give a demonstration or not, is a great chance to learn how to give a good demonstration by watching other 4-Hers give theirs, meet 4-Hers from other clubs, and get record book credit for participating in junior judging.

Preparing and giving demonstrations is required to earn any 4-H star ranking. Presentation Day is the activity that can earn you the most record book credit in 4-H for a single event. In your personal development form, you can count "U" for attending an event, "G" for participating in junior judging, "R" for giving a demonstration, and either "W" for winning a blue or red award or "V" if you win a gold award. (If you're a new member and this makes absolutely no sense to you, don't worry—we'll be having a separate record book workshop in the spring.)

Although you can give a demonstration to almost any group, giving one at Presentation Day is a great chance to practice your public speaking skills in front of a friendly audience of 4-Hers from all over the county. Whether you're planning to give a demonstration or not, I encourage everyone to come and support our club members at Presentation Day. ## Adult and Junior/Teen Leader Volunteers Needed for County Presentation Day

All of the San Mateo County 4-H clubs are responsible for providing volunteers to work as judges and room MCs, room monitors and room clerks for Presentation Day on February 4<sup>th</sup>. Judges must be at least 15 years old, so senior 4-H members may volunteer, as well as parents and project leaders. Potential judges can visit <a href="http://ca4h.org/leadership/spd/index.asp">http://ca4h.org/leadership/spd/index.asp</a> for judging rubrics for each entry category.

Junior and senior high 4-H members are needed to serve as room MCs, room monitors and room clerks. The jobs require helping set up the presentation rooms, making sure the judges in each room have the materials they need, welcoming guests, introducing judges, introducing each demonstration, and distributing and collecting the junior judging forms. 4-H members who volunteer to help with Presentation Day earn record book credit for their efforts and follow in the tradition of former 4-H members like United States First Ladies Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis and Rosalynn Carter.
