

# Toy / Gift Drive at the November Meeting

Our club is collecting toys for St. Francis Center in Redwood City. St. Francis Center provides a variety of services for very poor families. In December, the center's "Christmas Store" gives their client families an opportunity to select one or two toys for each child in the family. Often, the toys from the center's "Christmas store" are the only toys a child receives all year.

Well-made basic toys with lasting appeal, including soccer balls and other sports balls, small motorized toy vehicles, and dolls are always very popular. Good choices for teens include gift certificates from Redwood City stores such as Target and Ross that sell a variety of merchandise and are close to the neighborhoods served by St. Francis Center.

We've been requested to especially consider donating gifts for 12- to 16-year olds, as they often don't have enough of these at the center. Please donate a gift that you would enjoy receiving.

The Junior/Teen leaders also ask each club member to bring a nonperishable food item to the November general meeting for the club's annual Thanksgiving food drive. Club member's donations will be given to Second Harvest Food Bank. Please do not bring opened food containers or glass containers.

The most-needed food items include canned tuna, powdered milk, peanut butter (no glass jars, please), pasta, low-sugar cereals, 100% fruit juices in single serving boxes, meals in a can (stews, chili, soups), and food with pop-top lids.

## Registration Reminders

All Parents: Please consider becoming a registered volunteer. Registered adult volunteers receive liability protection for all 4-H sponsored events (such as driving for field trips, visiting the farm, etc.), and help ensure the safety of all our children.

Farm Parents: If your child plans to have an animal at the farm this summer, we strongly encourage you to register as an Adult Resource Leader. No child may be at the farm unless accompanied by at least one officially registered adult. That means that you and your child may not be alone at the farm (for a morning feeding, etc.), unless you are registered with 4-H. Take care of this important requirement before the spring animals appear!

**All New Members:** Registration closes at the end of December. Please submit those forms and checks back as soon as possible. Please register online, and then give me a printed medical form and a \$52 check made payable to San Carlos Eaton Hills 4-H.

### Medical Form Reminder

**Parents:** Please remember to provide each of your child's project leaders with a separate completed medical form by the first project meeting. Forms can be found on our website <a href="https://www.sancarlos4h.org">www.sancarlos4h.org</a>. (Look for the link at the top of the home page.) Be sure to discuss with the project leader any information that may impact your child's participation in project activities.

**Project Leaders:** Do not allow parents to drop off their child at your first meeting unless you have a completed and signed medical form in hand. ## The 2011 Honey Harvest

On a beautiful Sunday afternoon we harvested honey from the three newly established colonies on the Eaton Hills 4-H farm. Two dedicated bee project members – Sonya and Cale, plus another volunteer, Nick, worked diligently to extract the sweet and fragrant bounty. Honey combs were neatly uncapped and spun in the centrifuge with great vigor and some endurance. A few bees got interested in the residual honey on the wax caps. They got some of their friends, and soon there were several dozens of bees robbing the spoils. Sonya, Cale and Nick then worked in the kitchen where they boiled jars and lids. They filtered the honey and filled the jars. After a few hours hard work with plenty of goofing off in between, they had twenty 16 oz. jars and thirty 8 oz. jars of amber honey in glass jars with white lids on them.

#### Honey for sale

Honey sales support the bee project. The honey is the finest boutique honey: it is local, no chemicals are used during the honey harvest, and our bees are not medicated. We do not use hot knives or commercial bottling equipment, so the volatile compounds in the honey are not lost to heat.

Honey will be sold at the general meetings.
