
Don't Forget Those Medical Forms!

Hands across the Generations 4-H at the Elms

During our regular trips to this San Carlos senior living facility, we will make new friends, teach skills and learn something ourselves. Activities might include helping seniors with their iPads, dancing to music from their juke box, playing wii bowling, gardening, reading aloud, and playing board games. Sign up and help us decide! ...Ages 8 and up...

Community Detectives Mission: San Carlos – All Ages

Do you like figuring things out? Do you like coming up with creative ideas?

Community Detectives is on the case. In this project, you will use your detecting skills to figure out problems in San Carlos that need to be solved. The mysteries are "What does San Carlos need?", "What are the problems?", "What can we do about it?" and "How can we make San Carlos even better?"

You will join together with other 4H members and create a community-service project that makes San Carlos an even better place to live, play and learn. What's the problem we're going to solve? For now, that remains a mystery...for you to help solve.

Horse Project: Ages 9-13

The 4H Horse Project is intended to be a fun and interactive way to teach kids about horses, and themselves, through their interactions with horses on the ground. There is much more to horses than just riding and so emphasis will be placed on acquiring basic horse knowledge and the importance of building relationship with horses.

Computer Programming:

Love computers? Want to get to know yours better? Sign up for computer programming this year. This project will teach computer programming using the MIT Scratch program. Ages 10 & Up

Pen Pride Project: Get involved with raising animals on the farm and making money for San Mateo County 4-H while you do it. The Pen Pride project members will raise a pair of pigs and the responsibility for care and farm work will be shared among the members. Have you wondered if raising animals is for you? This can be your chance without the full commitment of a large animal.

Want to Go to CAL (Creating a Leader Conference)?

4-H members in 7th grade and up are invited to register for the North Central Division Creating a Leader Conference at Walker Creek Ranch, Petaluma. It will be held from January 23-25, 2015. The North Central division includes Sonoma, Marin, San Mateo, San Francisco, Santa Clara, Alameda, Contra Costa, Solano, Napa, Yolo, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Calaveras, Amador, and El Dorado counties.

Successful leadership is best learned in two ways: by observing it in others and by trying it oneself. The CAL Leadership Team is composed of former delegates who are now in charge of planning and delivering the Conference. The overall focus of CAL Conference is to provide a platform for youth leaders to share their joy, knowledge, and enthusiasm with their peers. The educational focus of CAL Conference is for delegates to enhance their techniques to demonstrate leadership in how they behave, in their attitudes, and in the words they choose to use. Important Attendance Policy Reminder San Carlos-Eaton Hills 4-H Club Attendance Policy

80% attendance at the club's monthly general meetings and 80% attendance at the project meetings are needed to exhibit any project at the San Mateo County Fair. 80% attendance at the club's monthly general meetings is required to obtain a star rank. 80% attendance at project meetings is required to earn record book credit for -project completed for each project.

An <u>excused</u> absence will not count against the 80% calculation.

Excused absences include illness, religious commitments, or mandatory school activities (one-time meeting, school play, or concert). Other excuses may be presented to the Steering Committee for authorization.

Bring a note to the club secretary the month before or after your excused absence so it can be recorded.

Homework and school social activities are examples of non-excused absences.

If you will have to leave early or arrive late on a regular basis, please provide a note of explanation to the club secretary. You can still receive credit for attendance, but more than two late arrivals or early departures will disqualify you from earning a 100% participation pin.

You are responsible to find out what you missed at the general meetings.

You are encouraged to make-up the missed meeting with community service time: volunteering at schools or special-needs programs, or representing the club at Lions Club activities, Hometown Days, and the San Mateo County Fair (auction, cake booth, Redwood Hall attendant, and Pen Pride).
