

San Carlos Eaton Hills 4-H Horse Project Sponsored by SMCHA

This 4-H Horse Project is intended to be a fun and interactive way to teach kids about horses, and themselves, through their interactions with horses. Most activities will take place on the ground as riding is not a primary focus of this program.

Learning objectives include an understanding of horse psychology, basic horse anatomy and horsemanship skills such as safety, haltering, tying, grooming and leading.



As well, focus will be placed on building trust, developing relationship, making connection and establishing partnership. These skills are directly transferrable to interactions with other people and therefore, the overall goal is to develop leadership skills while strengthening social and emotional competence.
