For example, I learned that the judge can know more or less how you will be placed within the first couple seconds after you enter the arena. Microscope Madness: On Saturday, March 24th, we had our 3rd S.T.E.M meeting. The meeting theme this time was Microscopes. Our leader Anna, had some slides already for us to look at, but we could also bring our own. It was really cool to look at the different organisms and plants. You can see a lot with a microscope, that you can't see without one. After we saw all the slides we wanted, we got to make our own. We made slides on roots of basil, lettuce, and, wheatgrass. We cut the roots off and put them in water, to make the roots flat. Then we added methylene blue die so we could see the roots better. They looked really cool. After that, we got to find anything outside and put it on a slide. The coolest thing we found outside was a small bug. But in total, we ended up using: a part of an orange, a fern leaf, mud, water, fungus, and fiber from a doormat. The meeting was really fun and cool. Goat Project

Lamb Project



A couple of weeks ago I went to the pre-fair check-in. This is only for large livestock, like lambs, goats and pigs. At the pre-fair check-in the vet checks the lamb's dock (the tail) to make sure it is not too short. If the dock is too short, the lamb does not get into fair. I was pretty nervous while waiting in line at check-in. I was worried that my lamb, Philby, might not get in, but he checked out fine! The next scary part was the ear tagging. I held onto Philby when the vet was putting the ear tag into his ear. Philby jumped pretty high, but I held onto him so that he wouldn't hurt himself. That was a stressful day for Philby and me. He was happy to be back on the farm. --Zerach Chan

On March 31, I went to pre-fair check-in. Pre-fair check-in is when all the lambs, goats, and pigs go to the county fairground to get a health check and ear tag by a California State Certified Veterinarian. I was very nervous about my lamb not getting pass check-in because I wasn't sure if his dock (tail) was long enough. When all of the lambs arrived to the fairgrounds, we all haltered our lambs and walked them into the line of other lambs and goats. When it was Latte's (my lamb) turn to get a health check, I tried to remain calm. Dr. Seals (the veterinarian) greeted me then started the check-up. He first glanced at his mouth and nose then moved over to his dock. When Dr. Seals was checking Latte's dock, I tensed up. Dr. Seals let me know that Latte was all good and ready for fair when he started to read out Latte's scrapie tag number. I was overjoyed! Latte got a flashy, new, orange fair tag indicating that he is in fair! -- Tia Chan
