Vice President for Program



Dungeons & Dragons Project

D&D is a fun tabletop role-playing game that can bring together strangers. It is very engaging. You choose a race and a class out of many different choices that are based off of fantasy. Someone who has the title of the Dungeon Master (DM) runs your story, called a campaign.

For example, in the 4-H D&D project run by Logan and Adrian Spinali, I am playing a Dwarf Druid who can cast spells and turn into animals. Adrian and Logan moved the game onto a virtual D&D program called Roll20 that is the exact same thing as regular D&D except for it is on the computer. Equine Project

This Spring, for Equine Project, each member was researching a horse related topic and was going to present it at the Portola Valley Horse Fair. However, due to the COVID 19 pandemic, the horse fair was cancelled and so were our project meetings. Our project leader encouraged us to, instead, write an article on our topic and then she worked with the San Mateo County Horsemen's Association so that our articles can be published in their June magazine. I just won an award from them for my article on "What Horses Eat in the Wild." Here is my article:

What Do Horses Eat In The Wild?

In the wild, horses eat mostly grass, but they also eat forage or browse plants such as forbs and shrubs. Grasses are plants with narrow leaves and parallel veins, such as the Idaho Fescue Grass, Squirrel Tail Grass, and the Great Basin Wild Rye. The wild grasses that horses eat tend to look more like weeds than common lawn grasses, which, incidentally, are not good for horses because they do not have good nutrition content. Forbs are flowering wild plants with net-like veins on their leaves that are found in prairies. Some forbs that horses eat are the Scarlet Globemallow and the Indian Paintbrush. Shrubs are woody plants with multiple stems, such as Juniper, Bitterbrush, or Greasewood. Although horses, in general, are not made for eating meat, wild horses might eat a bite of fish found lying on the ground.

As important as it is to understand *what* wild horses eat, it is also important to understand *how* they eat. Wild horses may move up to 20 miles per day, continually eating grass, forbs, and shrubs along the way. They eat for an estimated 15-17 hours per day. This movement is beneficial for the horses because it helps food move through the digestive system. Another beneficial behavior of wild horses is bending over while they eat. This is their natural posture because their food is growing low on the ground. This helps them because it positions their mouth correctly and it ensures that their food mixes well with their saliva. Eating from the ground also positions their head so that debris in the nasal passages gets flushed out by nasal secretions, reducing respiratory problems. When we learn about wild horse behavior, we can learn about ways to help our own pet horses have the most natural and healthy life possible. —Clara Hause Stephenson
