Right side of hat

- Year completion pin (primary, junior, intermediate and senior)

-place above the stripe of the year the pin was earned, starting with the primary pins next to the 4-H clover .

- Officer pins align with year earned.
- 100% Attendance pins place below the stripe of the year the pin was earned.

A 4-H uniform hat is NOT required for membership in the California 4- H Youth Development Program or for participation in any 4-H activity, event, or occasion.
